After finishing my training in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry in Israel, I have pursued a career in Neuropsychiatry, and have been involved in the establishment of a national unit for neuropsychiatry for children with Epilepsy.

I am also involved in NZ Health IT, serving as a clinical lead for some of our local and national IT projects, alongside my role in the TLG¹ executive group. Part of the latter is promoting additional telepsychiatry framework in NZ, as I am chairing the TLG Mental Health Workgroup.
